

Way Up High In An Apple Tree

Can Can

Motor Skills, Observation & Discovery, Visual Discrimination

Nesting Cans

Gather three or more empty fruit or vegetable cans of different sizes. Place masking tape around the lip of each can to cover any sharp edges. Show your child how the smaller cans can nest within the larger cans, and encourage him to nest all of the cans. Show him how to build a tower by stacking the cans on top of each other. Talk with your child about the differences in sizes while you sort the cans from biggest to smallest.

Uncover the Toy

Let your child watch as you place a small toy on his play table, and cover it with the smallest can. Cover that can with the next largest can, and then the next largest can, etc. until all of the cans have been used. Encourage your child to remove the cans to reveal the toy.
